### The Bernoulli process

- A sequence of independent Bernoulli trials
- At each trial:
  - $P(\text{success}) = P(X = 1) = p$
  - $P(\text{failure}) = P(X = 0) = 1 - p$
- Examples:
  - Sequence of ups and downs of the Dow Jones
  - Sequence of lottery wins/losses
  - Arrivals (each second) to a bank

### Random processes

- First view: sequence of random variables  $X_1, X_2, \dots$
- $E[X_t] =$
