Note the queue of ships waiting to enter the Canal

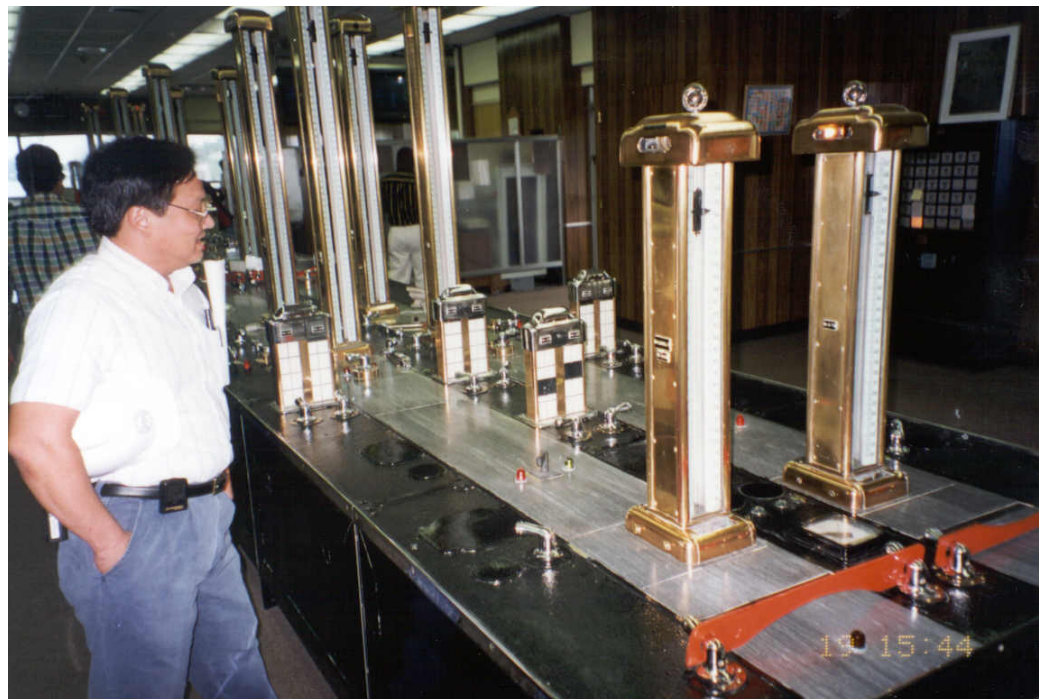


Miraflores Lock



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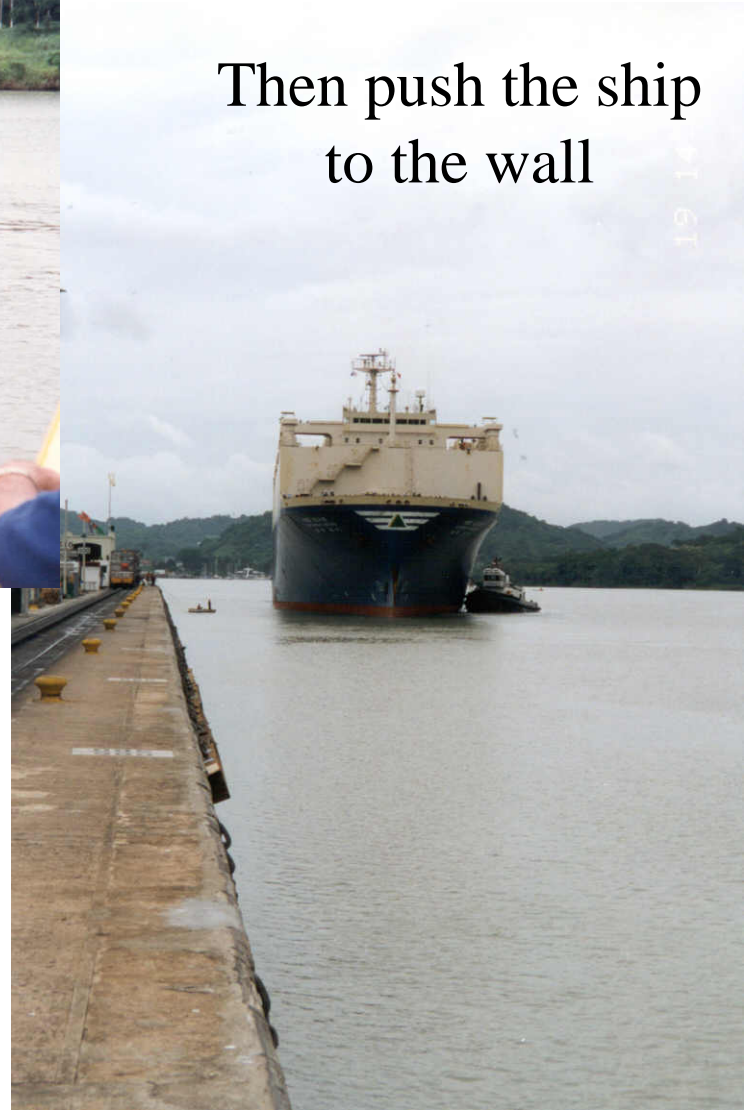


**Original Art Deco

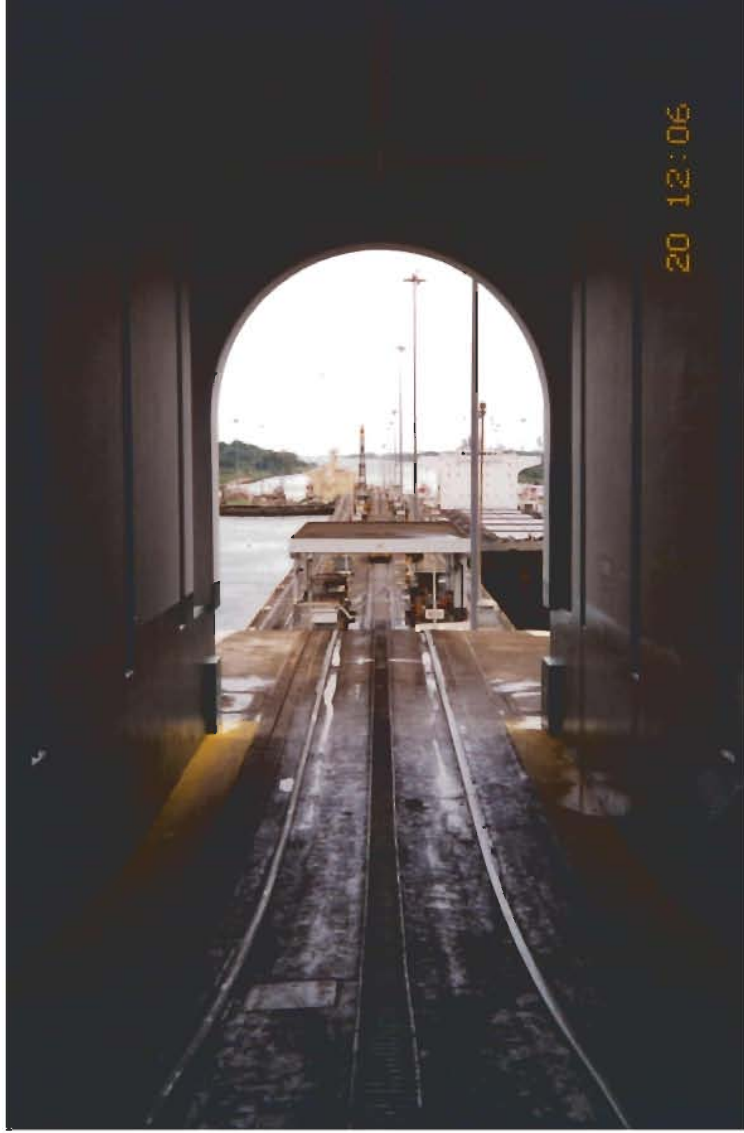
