

For the phonology/morphology/phonetics quiz on 3/9, you should be comfortable with:

- dividing words into morphemes (English, and also analyzing unfamiliar data sets)
- stating conditions on allomorphs
- making gross distinctions on spectrograms (e.g., which of these is a fricative, and which is a vowel?)
- stating phonological rules, using features, figuring out which things are allophones
- reading and writing IPA (you should know all the IPA symbols that are used to describe English, along with the symbols for non-English fricatives)
- classifying sounds by their distinctive features (e.g., which of these are velar?).
- the basic content of Donca Steriade's guest lecture; you'll be asked a question designed to determine whether you were there and paying attention (it won't require an in-depth understanding of the theory she presented--you won't be asked to do an analysis using her theory, for example).
