After going through the exhibit, respond to the following questions:

- 1. Critique the goals of the exhibit. What does the exhibit aim to teach visitors? If you were designing a similar exhibit about understanding models, would you choose similar educational objectives? Why or why not? What's missing in the exhibit, if anything?
- 2. Choose one particular component (e.g. wave tank, pyramids, fish farming....) to answer the following questions:
  - a. Describe the component. What does it communicate to visitors about models?
  - b. Is the component effective at fulfilling the exhibit's goals? Why or why not? (You might draw from the evaluation to answer this question if information is available on your chosen exhibit).
- 3. Did the exhibit affect your understanding of models? Do you think your reaction was similar or different from an average museum visitor? Why/why not?
- 4. Suggest an additional component focused on the use of models in decision-making. Briefly summarize the goals of this component, and describe how you would implement it in a museum setting.
